2030 Vision

We are a welcoming home to over **8,000** people seeking Jesus Christ and growing in the grace of the gospel. With all our efforts wholly dependent on God, we make disciples across all ages; every stage of life has a portion in the church. We celebrate **300** baptisms every year. We are a safe place for the broken and suffering to come and receive hope and care. We demonstrate the ministry of presence as we rejoice with those who rejoice and mourn with those who mourn. We send disciples into their homes, into neighborhoods, into our city, and into the nations. We have planted and revitalized **30** churches and have **100** missionary units on the field among **10** unreached people groups. We have seen more than **50,000** disciples rise from our campuses, church plants, revitalization efforts, and missionaries. We have generously resourced millions of people across the globe as we share the gifts that God has entrusted to us. Every day, in all spaces, through each season of life, we are building beyond ourselves, living the greater story together, and creating a kingdom legacy for generations to come.

n August 15, The Village Church celebrated. Our last campus—South-lake—had transitioned to become Restoration Church, and we were one church in one location again. It was a momentous occasion. Multiply was a major turning point in the life of The Village. Now, four years later, each of our former campuses are thriving as autonomous local churches. The Lord is so good.

THE VILLAGE CHURCH DENTON

Grace Temple Baptist Church began considering a merger with The Village Church to revitalize their congregation after decades of faithful ministry in Denton. In 2007, after a season of prayer and fasting, **Grace Temple united** with The Village to form the Denton campus. On August 23, 2015, The Village Church Denton transitioned into autonomy, and they continue to serve as a light in their unique city.

NORTHWAY CHURCH

After 57 years of faithful ministry, the leaders of Northway Baptist Church felt it was right to merge with The Village Church and become the Dallas Northway campus in 2009. A decade later on September 29, 2019, our Dallas Northway campus was commissioned to become Northway Church, an autonomous local body. Though they've faced some hardship along the way, Northway Church remains committed to glorifying God by making disciples of Jesus Christ.

REDEMPTION STORY CHURCH

On July 21, 2013, The Village Church launched its fourth campus in Fort Worth, and it was only a few years until the campus elders felt called to transition to autonomy. Sadly, the campus had to endure a difficult season of trial and suffering that delayed their plans. After walking through a period of healing, the Fort Worth campus officially transitioned to become Redemption Story Church on January 1, 2021. Now, they are able to better contextualize their ministry for the people who call Fort Worth home while they work to further their gospel mission.

CITIZENS CHURCH

After several years of praying for an opportunity, we launched the Plano campus in fall 2014. God moved in incredible ways among our people in Plano, including a building exchange with another church in the area. On August 1, 2019, in the middle of a challenging season, the Plano campus became Citizens Church. Though it hasn't always been easy, the Lord has been faithful to Citizens Church as they seek to love all people and serve one kingdom.


RESTORATION CHURCH

Our Southlake campus officially launched on August 14, 2016, after merging with Carroll Baptist Church. Soon after the campus launched, the elders of The Village rolled out their vision for Multiply, and preparations began to transition to autonomy. On July 4, 2021, our Southlake campus celebrated its first service as Restoration Church. Now, they have the opportunity to embrace their new identity and continue to proclaim the gospel in Southlake.








art of our 2030 vision is seeing 300 baptisms every year, and in order to reach that goal, we had to shift the way we've traditionally celebrated new believers. At the end of our services on Easter Sunday, Pastor Matt invited anyone who desired to profess their faith in Christ to come and be baptized. We have continued to leave the baptismal waters open to any who would come and confess Jesus as Lord. Since that day, we have celebrated over 120 baptisms!

In addition to spontaneous baptisms, we have continued to set aside dedicated time for scheduled baptisms, where the church can hear stories of life change and praise God for them. That's what happened on Saturday, May 8, as seven girls from the same Middle School Ministry small group stepped out in faith and were baptized in a lake together in front of friends and family. It was a beautiful testimony of the power of community, especially in the lives of students!

oming out of 2020, mental health was at the forefront of the national conversation, and it has remained an important topic throughout the year. Our Care Ministry exists to help address these needs in our church body through accessible programs and traumainformed practices. Recovery Groups continued to draw in people from outside our church walls and offer them hope and redemption in Christ. The Art of Care class wrapped up its first year in the spring and began a new year in the fall. More and more men and women are being equipped to advocate for those dealing with mental health issues, marriage struggles, abuse cycles, dysfunctional relationship patterns, substance abuse, and more.

Back in June, Pastor Matt challenged our congregation to raise \$100,000 to help fund our church planting efforts. Our church rose to the challenge and then some. In the end, we raised over **\$600,000** in one week!

This fall, Union Church and Trinity Gospel Church officially launched in Brighton, Michigan, and South Dallas, respectively. Please continue to pray for Ethan Ezikian,

Randle Bishop, and their families as they seek to minister in their communities.

We also commissioned two church planters and two church revitalizers to go forth with the calling God has given them. Dave Lee is planting Icon Church in Plano, Spencer Jacobson is planting Beacon Church in Bedford/Hurst, and Larry Thompson and Matt Clakley are each seeking to bring new life to churches that are currently struggling. We also welcomed three new church planting residents—Justin Broady, Marcus Wilson, and Josh Yen.



e believe God has uniquely gifted and called each of us to play a part in advancing His kingdom in our local community. Our Local Missions Ministry is committed to supporting the work of our partner organizations by providing resources and people to help them carry out their missions. February's major ice storm gave us the opportunity to join Communities in Schools of North Texas in distributing water, filters, plumbing supplies, and more to over 190 homes in our area! And when Afghan refugees began arriving in DFW following the turmoil in their county, our church sprang into action to provide desperately needed essentials. We also launched a new Local Missions page on our website to help our people easily find ways to serve those in need around us.

\$75,000 **IN RENT ASSISTANCE OVER THE LAST 18 MONTHS**



In November, we partnered with Christian Community Action for a holiday food drive that helped provide Thanksgiving meals to over **600** families in need. We love partnering with local organizations like CCA and have continued to do so with others like YoungLives, Lewisville ISD, and Sparrow Collective. Thanks to your generosity, we've been able to provide **\$75,000** in rent assistance over the last 18 months!

100 UPG Cooperative

Unreached people groups have little to no access to the gospel, and it's our vision to have 100 missionary units among 10 unreached people groups by 2030. To that end, we've partnered with other like-minded churches and organizations to form the 100 UPG Cooperative to better care for those who are reaching unreached people groups around the world. This year, we had over 40 people go through our Mission of God class and learn how to immediately engage in God's global purpose. Our Sending team is committed to catalyzing church

Fall Festival

Another way we engaged with our community this year was through our Fall Festival in October. On the surface, this event might look like candy and costumes, but it was so much more. A welcoming gathering in our parking lot drew in those who might otherwise never consider attending church. While the festivities were fun for our church family, the opportunity to bless our wider community was the real mission.








Our Bible Study on the first half of Romans explored the depths of God's righteousness and the beauty of life in Christ.


