SAMARITAN'S PURSE – U.S. DISASTER RELIEF

When disasters strike across the country, Samaritan's Purse U.S. Disaster Relief volunteers seek to be the hands and feet of Jesus to hurting homeowners. This is the required orientation for all TBM Disaster Relief volunteers. This course is a prerequisite for all other specialty training. Credentials received through this training are necessary for entry into disaster areas and are good for five years.

WIDOWS & ORPHANS

BROKEN HALOS HAVEN

Broken Halos Haven serves young widows and their school-aged children by offering no-cost, overnight stays at their private "grief retreat" home located in Old Town Lewisville. They have ongoing serving opportunities to help clean and get the house ready for visiting families.

Indoor tasks include: making beds, cleaning bathrooms, sweeping, mopping, dusting, etc. Outdoor tasks may include: pulling weeds, washing windows, mowing, edging, etc.

When widows are thrust into managing their homes alone, the household projects their husbands could've tackled now sit on a growing "honey-do" list. That's where the Honey Dudes come in! On designated dates, you'll swoop into a widow's home to knock out some of those daunting tasks. From repairing drywall, mulching, moving storage boxes, repairing furniture, electrical and plumbing, organizing garages, and simply inflating bike tires for her kids—you name it—we'll try to tackle it!

SERVING AT HOME IDEAS

"...And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'" Matthew 25:40

- **Move to the front yard** – Set up picnic tables or chairs in your front yard to create space for connection. Say "hi," invite a neighbor over, or host a casual evening with lemonade and conversation.
- **Bless your delivery drivers** – Leave snacks and water bottles by your front door with an encouraging sign that says "Thank you for all you do!"
- **Support first responders** – Assemble goody bags or baked goods and deliver them to your local police or fire station with a note of appreciation.
- **Brighten someone's day** – Drop off fresh flowers at a local nursing home or memory care facility. Include a card with a simple prayer or Scripture verse.
- **Host a neighborhood book swap** – Set out a bin in your yard with gently used books and a sign that says "Take one, leave one!" Great for kids and adults alike.
- **Bake and bless** – Make extra treats the next time you bake and deliver them to a neighbor you don't know well yet—or someone who might be going through a hard time.
- **Prayer walk your block** – Walk your street regularly and silently pray for each home you pass. You can also leave a handwritten note offering to pray for any specific needs.
